- I. Call to Order – 7:00 PM**
- II. Responding to the roll call** were Bill Svehla, Lindley Reubin, Brenda Newell, Janet Castillo, Ralph Edge and Carl Hill.
- III. APPROVAL –**  
***March 2024 Council Minutes***  
A. Cncl. Svehla moved to approve minutes.  
B. Cncl. Castillo 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion.  
C. There being no discussion, approval was so ordered without objections.
- March 2024 Financials***  
\* Mayor Behling explained that there were two Monthly Financial Summary Reports due to internal changes within Farmers and Merchants Bank. The first statement reflects February 29, 2024 through March 15, 2024 and the second statement reflects March 15, 2024 through March 29, 2024.  
A. Cncl. Reubin moved to accept the financials.

- IV. Police Report: March 2024**  
A. Mayor Behling stated that the March 2024 Monthly Report was being presented and asked if there were any questions concerning the report. There being no questions, report is on file for public review.

A. Mayor Behling stated that the report March 11, 2024 thru April 9, 2024 was being presented and asked if there were any questions concerning the report. There being no questions, report is on file for public review.

A. State Aid Street Project-Update  
1. Mayor Behling stated that the update remains the same as last month. He indicated there won't be a bid until August or September of 2024. The street project won't be completed until sometime in 2025.  
B. Rural Community Grant re Security Cameras  
1. Mayor Behling indicated that My-Techs will be installing the security cameras in City Hall this Saturday, April 20<sup>th</sup>. The grant for this project will not be awarded until May of 2024.  
2. A brief discussion followed with Cncl. Newell asking how much the cost for

the cameras inside City Hall would be. The inside cameras will cost \$7,358.18. Mayor Behling stated that the grant would cover approximately \$1,946.78 of the cost of park surveillance cameras totaling \$3,893.55. Total amount of camera system will be \$11,251.73. Mayor Behling indicated that at some point a budget adjustment will be needed. Cncl. Edge reiterated he was in favor of the surveillance cameras because it is a safety measure.

- C. Solar Eclipse-April 8, 2024
- 1. A discussion was held about the solar eclipse and the tourism rate in the local area. Mayor Behling stated that he still felt comfortable with closing the park to vehicular traffic even though there was a lack of tourism in this geographic area.
